The IG Competition Awaits Your Participation

The Individual Growth Committee wants to use this opportunity to announce the re-opening of a wonderful program of Business Women of Missouri.

Since we have expedited the development of our IG Training Program by purchasing the right to use the national materials, we have decided to proceed with an individual growth speech competition for the 2010-2011 year.

Local clubs are asked to urge members to participate, and local competition is encouraged. Any member who is designated by a local club as a local winner and who meets the competition criteria listed in a later paragraph should complete the IG Participation form from page 75 of the local manual and submit it to Peggy Cochran, P. O. Box 890, Rocky Mount, MO 65072 by March 1, 2011.

There will be three components to the competition:

1. Participants will be asked to deliver a 5 minute prepared speech on one of the following topics at the State Conference: Equal Rights Amendment, Pay Equity, Educational Equity and Funding, Health Care Reform, Domestic Violence, Reproductive Choice, Mentoring, Women in Politics, Appreciating Diversity, Dependent Care for Persons of all Ages and Access to Mental Health Care.
2. Participants should be prepared to deliver a 2 minute impromptu speech. Subjects will be drawn at random at the state competition.
3. Participants will undergo a personal interview and be judged on their demeanor, answers, skills, talents, etc.

In order to be eligible for the state competition, a participant must meet the following criteria:

- A. Be living, working, training or continuing education in the area served by the sponsoring local organization.
- B. Be a member in good standing of the local and state.
- C. Have completed the IG modules within the preceding 5 years.
- D. Support the BWM mission and vision and pledge that she will not speak against the BWM legislative platform issues in their capacities as representatives of the local club and the BWM.

2010 Women's Professional Empowerment Alliance

The Illinois Federation of Business and Professional Women hosted the annual Women's Professional Empowerment Alliance event in O'Fallon, IL on July 30-31. There were 115 attendees, including nine representing the Business Women of Missouri.

The weekend began with a ribbon cutting by the O'Fallon Chamber of Commerce followed by a fashion show and a shopping opportunity presented by Dillard's department store. The models presented the latest in casual, business, and formal wear.

Saturday morning opened with a breakfast and auction. BWM took some items for the silent auction. The proceeds of those items were split between BPW/IL and BWM. There were plenty of opportunities to shop for tools, jewelry, purses, food items, candles, cosmetics, garments, and more from the many vendors.

Martha Rohlfling from the Illinois State Treasurer's office spoke of the new credit card laws that went into effect this year. She explained the problems of credit card debt and ways to overcome it. Ms. Rohlfling was followed by a presentation from the Enterprising and Professional Women-USA, the US chapter of International BPW. Susan is also a member of "Women Impacting Public Policy" (WIPP), a non-partisan group that works to pass legislation to improve women's rights.

I was honored to participate in a panel discussion with BPW and former BPW leaders from other states discussing the future of our organization and ways to stay connected to move forward.

There were many great ideas and I believe we can all help each other remain successful. Next year's multi-state event will be held in the Minnesota-Twin City area.

Care packages for Women in the Military -

The Objective of the Women Joining Forces Committee is to raise awareness of the concerns of women in the military. We want these women to know the our organization appreciates their dedication to serving our country. To show this appreciation, we plan to prepare Gift Packages to those women who are serving in foreign lands.

You can help by bringing appropriate items to the December Board meeting. We will probably be using the 12" x 12" x 5-1/2" box, prepaid rate of \$10.95. We also need names of women who you would like to receive a package. Get all of the necessary ID numbers and their complete address. I know from sending packages last year that everything has be exactly correct or they will not receive the package.

All items need to be small, no chocolate, no breakables. Acceptable: beef jerky/slim jims, energy bars, sunflower seeds, peanuts, jolly rancher hard candy, smarties or sweet tart candies, Avon skin so soft, chewing gum, AA cell alkaline batteries, personal hygiene gear: disposable razors, toothbrush, tooth paste, eye wash/drops, zip lock style storage bags and other small useful items. Put yourself in their place - away from home, what personal items would you like to find in a parcel from the States. I will bring Christmas cards for us to write notes.

Homemade foods are discouraged for projects such as ours. When you know the recipient, you can send their favorites, as long as they are packaged properly.

I would appreciate receiving names of recipients as soon as possible. It will help me to know how many prepaid packages to purchase. (I thought we could assemble them there.) I have suggested that clubs might make an effort to identify women in their community who have returned (from active duty) and could use help making Christmas merrier for their family. Do what you can to help these ladies and their families.

Garden Casserole

| | |
|---|---|
| 2 pounds eggplant, peeled | 5 teaspoons salt, divided |
| ¼ cup olive oil | 2 medium onions, finely chopped |
| 2 garlic cloves, minced | 2 medium zucchini, sliced ½ inch thick |
| 5 medium tomatoes, peeled and chopped | 2 celery ribs, sliced |
| ¼ cup minced fresh parsley | ¼ cup minced fresh basil or 1 Tablespoon dried basil |
| ½ teaspoon pepper | ½ cup grated Romano cheese |
| 2 tablespoons butter | 1 cup Italian bread crumbs |
| 1 cup (4 ounces) shredded mozzarella cheese | |

Cut eggplant into ½-in-thick slices; sprinkle both sides with 3 teaspoons salt. Place in a deep dish; cover and let stand for 30 minutes.

Rinse with cold water; drain and dry on paper towels.

Cut eggplant into ½-in cubes; sauté in oil until lightly browned. Add onions, garlic and zucchini; cook 3 minutes. Add tomatoes, celery, parsley, basil, pepper and remaining salt; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 10 minutes. Remove from heat; stir in Romano cheese. Pour into a greased 13x9-in x 2-in baking dish. Combine crumbs and butter; sprinkle on top. Bake, uncovered, 375 for 15 minutes. Sprinkle with mozzarella cheese. Bake 5 minutes longer or until cheese is melted.
